- Deliver needed resources, through grants








## **Episcopal Asset Map**

- Partnership between The Episcopal Church and Episcopal Relief & Development.
- A tool to share the many gifts and the reach of The Episcopal Church
- An opportunity to examine our abundance and connect across The Episcopal Church (world-wide)
- One method to prepare a diocese for disaster response







## **Goals of the Asset Map**




- Grassroots populated with diocesan-level administration
- · A map that is housed in one location
- Highlight networks of outreach across the breadth and depth of The Episcopal Church

#### **How it Works**

- · Visit: episcopalassetmap.org
- Search by diocese, network or church-wide
- Go to pin you want to learn about or update:
  - Pins have been placed on the map for all assets in The Episcopal Church (as we know them)
  - Pins are placed based on geography even if NOT legally owned by diocese: schools, monastic communities, etc.

#### **How it works**

- "Take Survey" allows anyone to add information to a site's profile.
- Submitted information is reviewed and then approved by a Diocesan Map Administrator
- Updated information appears on map once approved (Diocesan and Church-Wide views)









## **Network maps**

- Map is also organized around Networks
  - Examples: Episcopal Conference of the Deaf, Jubilee Ministries, etc...
- Pins can be tagged as part of networks
- Pins still "belong" to diocese where they are located
  - Changes still need to be approved by diocesan map administrators







#### Possible risks

- Out-of-date information
  - Integrate into diocesan/network processes
  - Share best practices among dioceses on how to keep momentum
  - Have a team of volunteers that are willing to update the map on a regular basis
- False information
  - Diocesan map admins check data before posting
  - This is a rare occurrence





## **Strategies for Populating the Map**

- Fill out a survey for your congregation and maybe others in your area
- · Submit institutions that are missing
- Make videos of ministry projects to help spice up a page
- Engage young people to do cross-generational map population (great project for youth delegates at diocesan conventions)
- · Having incomplete information is motivating




